Dearest of the Dear,

I write to the special people—those who have the heart of God—who want the lost to be saved. May your reward be great now and forever. Let us look boldly into 2009 for a great harvest. We desire and expect it by God's grace.

As for 2009, we expect about 60 NEW students coming from Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, El Salvador, Nicaragua, and Panama. They will graduate in two years. Just think—this one class will reach thousands. If they convert 10 per year for 40 years, that results in 24,000 souls. This number should be multiplied by their disciples. Every year we have graduation. Think about what you are helping to accomplish with your support.

Also in 2009, we are stepping up our teaching on how to establish house churches. This will be accomplished in two ways. First, extra time in the classroom has been set aside for this teaching. Especially, we will teach how to equip every new member for good works. Secondly, the students will actually start and mature new churches in the house setting. From day one, the new churches will be evangelistic. They will be taught how to start other churches. God promised that He would supply all of our needs. We believe!

I plan to be in Central America January 3-27. Guatemala is the first week of teaching evangelism. Then I drive to Honduras for the same one week of teaching. Afterwards, I drive the seven-hour trip to Guatemala. I fly from Guatemala to Nicaragua for the final week. It is thrilling to teach the motivated students.

Later, probably in February, I will inform you of some dates when we will have a week-long campaign. Please consider joining us.

Let's consider something ugly—sin. Often sins are classified as sins of commission or sins of omission. All sin is horrible. A sin of commission, like murder, influences terribly for generations. Overt acts of drunkenness display the hurts involved with sin. Jesus talks about the sin of omission in Luke 10 in the story of the Good Samaritan. The priest and Levite passed by the man who had been beaten and robbed. They did not kick him, curse him, or do harm to him—they passed by, doing nothing; however, the Samaritan was moved by COMPASSION and showed MERCY. Thank you for showing compassion and mercy to the lost. Thank you for including missions and not omitting them.

The three schools will probably baptize approximately 1300 during the year. It would be wonderful to present each new convert with a Bible, as most do not have one of their own.
