Dear Respecters of the Great Commission,

Thank you, partners, for your faith in Jesus' mission—saving the lost. Thank you for having confidence in us to multiply the disciples in Central America. As always, all the glory goes to God.

Most of January I spent in Central America. Without a doubt, it was difficult to teach in three countries in three consecutive weeks. (Guatemala, then Honduras, then Nicaragua). Standing on concrete is hard on this old man's back and legs. The reward of seeing the faith and dedication of these students make the difficulties seem small. At this time, we have 95 students in the three schools. Students are from Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Costa Rica. They understand clearly that the Gospel is in their hands. They believe and expect God to provide for all their needs. In order to take the Gospel into all the world, we **MUST** reach the multitudes. God has shown us biblically how to multiply. These students see it clearly. They are confident that God will use them to do mighty things. I agree!

In touch economic times, we must stand tough for missions. The lost of Central America need for you to stand firm with us. Often missions is the first thing to go—it should be the last. I understand that a few are in desperate situations. Even then, purpose to maintain your help. Some can increase to make up the deficit that has already come. After eleven years of progress, we need steady, faithful, prayerful hands to maintain this work of God. I have confidence in you and in God.

How would you like to see our guys in action? Go on an evangelistic campaign with our new school (second year) in Nicaragua, April 13-19. A good travel day would be April 11. You could return April 18 or 19, depending on your situation. It will cost about \$1000 for travel, food, and hotel. Call me at 325-388-0000. Supporters, come see for yourselves. It will change your life.

Remember William Racancoj? He is the one who was beaten and left for dead. The two blood clots on his brain were dissolved. Some eye problems remain. By the way, he is the new director in Honduras. Pray for him!

This year each of the three schools plan to start and mature two or three house churches/cell groups. The students will go through the entire process. They will help with initial conversions, plus students will mature rapidly the new brothers. The new churches will be taught to start other churches.
